ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Medical Imaging (MI)

The Medical Imaging program begins once each year in the fall. Required application materials can be <u>submitted as they are completed</u>, <u>but all materials must be received</u> <u>before admission consideration</u>. Completed applicant files are reviewed on a rolling basis, and the process requires 3 to 4 weeks.

Enrollment is granted for a specific term. All admission criteria must be maintained, including satisfactory completion of required general education courses prior to beginning the program.

Early Applicants

The following criterion must be met:

- Completed fewer than 25 college credits
- Minimum high school cumulative grade point average of 3.8 on a 4.0 scale
- All transferable courses must be completed with a grade of C- or above

Transfer Applicants

The following criterion must be met:

- Transfer applicants must have earned 25 college credits, including 6 credits of the required science and/or college algebra coursework, prior to admission review.
- A minimum grade point average of 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale) in the following courses:
 - English Composition*
 - o Oral Communication*
 - o Sociology
 - o Psychology

- Anatomy and Physiology I with lab component*
- Anatomy and Physiology II with lab component*
- o General Physics* or Radiographic Physics
- College Algebra or higher math course*

*Courses used in GPA for students with a previous bachelor's degree at the time of application

- All transferable courses must be completed with a grade of C- or above.
- The BHS-Medical Imaging Degree in CT requires an ARRT Registered Technologist in Radiography, Nuclear Medicine Technology (registration through NMTCB is also accepted), or Radiation Therapy.
- The BHS-Medical Imaging Degree in MRI gives preference to ARRT Registered
 Technologist applicants. Students with a background in other health occupations including a
 patient care focus may be considered.

A minimum of 82 credit hours in prescribed general education coursework must be completed prior to enrollment at Allen College. Students attend a regionally accredited institution of their choice to complete the required prerequisite courses.

Applicants whose first language is not English must prove <u>English proficiency</u> prior to admission consideration.
