ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS Doctor of Physical Therapy

The DPT program begins each year in the spring semester.

- All required application materials are submitted through the <u>Physical Therapist Centralized</u> <u>Application System (PTCAS)</u>.
- The DPT program has 2 separate application windows, one opening in mid-January and the other opening in mid-June each year. Specific dates are listed in PTCAS.
- Applicants are encouraged to apply early. Applicants who apply early may be given priority over those in the later cycle.
- Only complete applicant files are reviewed.
- The review process requires four to six weeks.

To be considered for admission the following criterion must be met:

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution prior to matriculation
- Minimum 3.0 prerequisite grade point average (GPA)
 - Grade of C must be earned in all prerequisite coursework
 - Advanced Placement or CLEP credit will not be accepted
 - o Recommend all prerequisite coursework taken within ten years
 - Recommend no more than three prerequisites in progress at time of application
- In addition to the prerequisite GPA, one of the following three must be met:
 - o 3.0 undergraduate cumulative GPA
 - o 3.25 undergraduate cumulative GPA in the last 60 credit hours earned
 - o 3.0 graduate cumulative GPA in the last 24 credit hours earned
- Satisfactory completion of all prerequisite coursework before matriculation
- Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores using code 2960
- Two letters of recommendation: one from an academic or faculty member and one from a Licensed Physical Therapist
- Applicants whose first language is not English must prove <u>English proficiency</u>. The TOEFL exam is also required. Minimum scores are 550 on the written, 213 on the computer-based examination, or 79 on the internet-based examinations

Meeting admission criteria does not guarantee admission. The Physical Therapy Admissions Committee uses selection criteria to choose candidates best qualified for the program and practice of the profession.
