ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS Medical Imaging (MI)

The Medical Imaging program begins once each year in the fall. Required application materials can be <u>submitted as they are completed, but all materials must be received before admission</u> <u>consideration</u>. Completed applicant files are reviewed on a rolling basis, and the process requires 3 to 4 weeks.

Enrollment is granted for a specific term. All admission criteria must be maintained, including satisfactory completion of required general education courses prior to beginning the program.

Early Applicants

The following criteria must be met:

- Completed fewer than 25 college credits
- Minimum high school cumulative grade point average of 3.8 on a 4.0 scale
- All transferable courses must be completed with a grade of C- or above

Transfer Applicants

The following criteria must be met:

- Transfer applicants must have earned 25 college credits, including 6 credits of the required science and/or college algebra coursework, prior to admission review.
- A minimum grade point average of 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale) in the following courses:
 - English Composition*
 - Oral Communication*
 Sociology

• Psychology

- Anatomy and Physiology I with Lab*
- Anatomy and Physiology II with Lab*
- General Physics* or Radiographic Physics
 - College Algebra or higher math course*

*Courses used in GPA for students with a previous bachelor's degree at the time of application

- All transferable courses must be completed with a grade of C- or above.
- The BHS-Medical Imaging Degree in CT requires an ARRT Registered Technologist in Radiography, Nuclear Medicine Technology (registration through NMTCB is also accepted), or Radiation Therapy.
- The BHS-Medical Imaging Degree in MRI gives preference to ARRT Registered Technologist applicants. Students with a background in other health occupations, including a patient care focus, may be considered.
- Transfer applicants must communicate with the program director to verify that they have the credentials required for program eligibility prior to admission review.
- If the transfer applicant will be enrolled in the Externship courses, the applicant must work with the program director to establish a partnership with the clinical site of their choice prior to admission.

A minimum of 82 credit hours in prescribed general education coursework must be completed prior to admission at Allen College.

Applicants whose first language is not English must prove English proficiency prior to admission consideration.
