

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (MS in OT)

The MS in OT program begins once each year in the fall. Applications will not be considered until all required materials are received. Review of complete applicant files begins after the priority date. The selection process requires an interview prior to admission.

Priority Date

November 1

To be considered for admission, applicants must meet the criterion below:

- Minimum undergraduate grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- At minimum, a cumulative 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) in the following courses:
 - Anatomy & Physiology I with lab
 - Anatomy & Physiology II with lab
 - Science Course with lab (Biology or Physics recommended)
 - College Algebra or Statistics
- Earn grade of C or higher in all prescribed prerequisite courses. Course completion at the time of application is preferred.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must prove [English proficiency](#) prior to admission review.

Students will only be considered for admission for the upcoming academic year and will not be admitted for a start date beyond the upcoming year.

Meeting admission criteria does not guarantee an interview. Allen College uses a holistic admission review. The process balances academic achievement, work experience, extra-curricular involvement, leadership, community service, diversity, as well as, other applicable life experiences. Top applicants are accepted each year.
